

1 Check if you are ready to provide eOPS

- You have the training to safely deliver eOPS
- You have drug poisoning response equipment like a take home naloxone kit
- You are able to get emergency help if an accidental drug poisoning happens
- You are in a safe space to witness substance use
- You are comfortable to witness substance use and provide support
- You can follow the person's lead and view the person as the expert of their own health

2 Provide support during substance use

- Agree on a safety plan in case of accidental drug poisoning or prolonged sedation
- Clean your hands and put on appropriate personal protective equipment for exposure concerns
- Provide access to harm reduction supplies
- Ask if they would like information or props for safer substance use
- Properly dispose of sharps

3 Provide support after substance use

- Monitor for at least 20 minutes for signs of accidental drug poisoning
- Respond to accidental drug poisoning and get emergency help if it happens
- Provide care for prolonged sedation if it happens
- Clean and disinfect any surfaces used
- Ask if they would like resources or referrals for health or social services
