COVID-19 mRNA Vaccines

- The product page for the Moderna COVID-19 mRNA Vaccine (mRNA-1273) has been revised to indicate that:
 - A thawing time of 2 hours and 30 minutes is required when the vaccine is moved from the freezer to the refrigerator.
 - The vaccine can be pre-loaded into a syringe for up to 6 hours.
- The After Care Sheet has been revised to include nausea and vomiting as other symptoms that may occur following receipt of a COVID-19 mRNA vaccine.
