Re: Appropriate Use of Point of Care HIV testing in BC

Please find attached revised table of contents for Chapter V and new guidelines titled "Appropriate Use of Point of Care HIV testing in BC." This document summarizes the characteristics and impact of POC HIV tests compared to standard HIV testing, and describes clinical scenarios and voluntary HIV counselling and testing settings where POC HIV tests are most indicated.

These guidelines have been posted to the CD Control Manual, Chapter 5. The accompanying evidence paper has been posted to the BCCDC website under the Statistics and Reports section ("Impact and Use of Point of Care HIV Testing: A Public Health Evidence Paper").

This guideline is intended to complement existing guidelines for the use of POC HIV test kits and client counselling with POC HIV testing ("Guidelines for Use of the POC HIV test kit: Information for the Health Care Professional in BC"; "Client Counselling Guidelines for Use with Point of Care HIV Test Kits").
