• Physical Assessment Section

The PHSA Non-Certified Practice Decision Support Tool: Pelvic Examination has been recently updated. Language was revised within the Assessment and Diagnostic Guideline to ensure alignment between the two documents and clarify differing scope between RN and RN(C)s performing pelvic exams.

• Site-Specific Testing Language

Revision to site-specific testing language has been reflected through the document to strive for safer conversations within STI assessment and care and reflect the diversity of individual's bodies.
