BC wide transition from PEDIACEL® to PENTACEL®



BC will be transitioning from PEDIACEL® (DTaP-IPV-Hib) to PENTACEL® (DTaP-IPV-Hib) vaccine as Sanofi will no longer be manufacturing PEDIACEL®.

PENTACEL® requires reconstitution and will be packaged with the QUADRACEL® and lyophilized Act-HIB® components in the same box. NEW Epidemiological reports: Hib and iGAS

- Since 2020, an increase of invasive
 Haemophilus influenzae type b (Hib) has been observed among adults in BC, with the majority of cases in recent years reporting housing instability and/or substance use as risk factors. Find the latest epidemiological summary for 2020-2023 here.
- In 2017, BC experienced the highest reported incidence of invasive group A streptococcal disease (iGAS) since this disease became notifiable in 1997. Since then, incidence of iGAS has remained higher than in the years preceding 2017, including throughout the COVID-19 pandemic period. Incidence in 2023 surpassed the previous maximum recorded in 2017. Read the 2013-2023 epidemiological summary here.

Vaccine Storage and Handling Course

The Vaccine Storage and Handling course on <u>LearningHub</u> has been updated. Updates include:

Immunization Course for Nursing Schools to Support BC's School Vaccination Program

A new course titled "How to Handle Your Vaccines Like a Champ" is currently in development, and will support nursing students to educate youth in BC classrooms before school clinics.

This course will be offered for free online, and will be part of the Kids Boost Immunity (KBI) initiative, which helps students better understand the vaccines they will receive in school. The course will include four comprehensive learning modules to ensure a positive clinic day experience, and will be available on KBI's sister site for adult learning, I Boost Immunity, in August.

COVID-19 Vaccine Dashboard

The COVID-19 Vaccination Coverage Dashboard provides an overview of COVID-19 vaccination rates throughout BC. It delineates two key eligible populations: individuals aged **65 and older, and those** aged at least 6 months with severe or moderate immunosuppression.

This dashboard is updated weekly on Thursdays and presents coverage rates categorized by age group, health authority, and local health area. Archived versions of previous dashboards are also accessible, providing insight into past vaccination campaigns.
