BC Infant RSV Immunoprophylaxis Program Q&A

First Nations Health Authority Abrysvo™ Coverage

The First Nations Health Authority (FNHA) has announced that it will <u>now provide</u> <u>reimbursement for Abrysvo™ vaccine</u>. This coverage is effective immediately.

Coverage Details: First Nations Health Benefits will accept reimbursement requests for vaccinations with the Abrysvo™ vaccine administered on or after August 25, 2024. Coverage for the full cost of the vaccine applies to pregnant individuals who were 32 to 36 weeks' gestation at the time of administration. To request reimbursement, clients must complete the FNHA Reimbursement Form.

Child Immunization

Interactive Coverage Dashboard

A new provincial interactive dashboard on childhood immunization coverage was published on the BCCDC website in October 2024. This dashboard provides increased geographic granularity on childhood immunization coverage rates:

- 1) By Community Health Service Area of residence for age-based cohorts (i.e., 2-year-olds and 7-year-olds) on the "Community-based" tab.
- By school for school-aged children (i.e., 7-year-olds, grade 6, grade 9) on the "School-based" tab.

The dashboard currently includes immunization coverage data up to the same time frame as that published in the 2023 immunization coverage reports and will be updated

annually, in alignment with the immunization coverage reports.

Vaccine Safety Pages Updated

The vaccine safety pages on <u>ImmunizeBC.ca</u> have undergone significant updates. In addition to new content, the pages have been rewritten and reformatted for easier navigation and improved accessibility. These updates provide clear, evidence-based information on vaccine development, approval, safety monitoring, side effects, ingredients, and the safety of multiple and combination vaccines.

The findings in this article titled "An exploration of the role of trust and rapport in enhancing vaccine uptake among Anishinaabe in rural northern Ontario" illustrate that decisions to vaccinate are influenced by various social, institutional, and ideological factors, as well as historical and contemporary relationships with government institutions and health care practitioners. In particular, Indigenous community members perceived their relationships with social services, health services, and educational institutions as coercive.
